- Develop, Renovate, and Manage Affordable Housing Properties






Who We Serve

- Nearly 16,000 Families
- 50,000 Individuals
- 24,000 Children (ages 0-18)
- 1,900 Seniors
- Race/Ethnicity:
 - Hispanic/Latino: 56.8%
 - Black/African American: 24.7%
 - Asian: 9.3%
 - White: 8.6%
- Average resident annual income: \$10,600
- Single Head Households: 78%





Our Major Programs

- Assisted Housing (HCV/Section 8):
 - Approx. 13,000 total combined vouchers
 - Over 38,000 program participants
- Veteran, Homeless and Senior Programs:
 - Nearly 300 VASH Vouchers (Veterans)
 - Over 120 units of Permanent Supportive Housing Units
 - 170 Senior Housing units






Our Major Programs
